## Introduction

This report outlines the need, and the outcome of the project for COVID-19 affected families.

### Need for the Ration Project:

Everyone is hit by the pandemic, the people who are hit most are the one's who are fighting the virus and hunger. Craftspeople, tribals, and transgenders are equally affected, as the migrant labourers, or the daily wage workers, but unfortunately they remain invisible and therefore ignored outside the safety net of regular salaries or social security, making them helpless. These people wonder what will finish them first - the virus or their hunger.

Some statistics around the impact of COVID-19 in the lives of the severely affected:

1. 70% of the 9 million artisans have lost their livelihoods
2. 81% of women work in the informal sector, 90% of whom lost jobs in one shot
3. More than 1 million Trans and non-binary individuals struggle with lack of funds, food, stigma, safety and mental health concern

Impact of the above is directly seen by these families having to fight hunger, resulting into:

1. Mass suicides
2. Increase in domestic violence

To onslaught the situation, Srujna decided to serve the transgenders, sex-workers, tribal community, and women artisans with ration kits and masks. The kit consists of the following items:

## Outcome:

1. Number of families supported: **235 families** were given ration kits

1. Transgenders: 83

2. MSM: 37

3. Lesbian: 5

4. Tribals: 110

2. Provision of Masks: Srujna realized the importance of providing masks along with the ration kit so as to be able to support the community in protecting themselves against the deadly virus. It went ahead and gave 5000 along with the kits to 5000 tribals



**125 transgenders, MSM and Lesbians received ration kits**



**110 tribal families were served ration kits and masks, at Aarey Colony Goregaon**
